


NATASHA DORFHU-BER (Villager) has been part of Santa Barbara High School theatre since her sophomore year. This is her second Santa Barbara High School produc-

A longtime member of the Ensemble Theatre as an actor and Playwright in Residence, Mr. Layman received his A.A. in English Literature from San Diego Mesa College (1980); a B.A. in English Literature from UCSB (1982); a M.A. in Creative Writing from Boston University (1987); and a Master's in Education from UCSB (1996).

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
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
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THE BIG TEN

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A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Why do we do this? Man, what's the point? I write this days after we have been burglarized in the theatre, our things taken by the Philistines who eat money and consume the perishables of the world. Burglarized by the dead-in-life. I was fueled by anger this week, and I hated the feeling. I watched as we erected false fronts and spoke scripted words, a hundred kids pretending they hunt a beast or live as human furniture in a castle made of luan and hope, kids playing instruments or dancing with madcap napkins...It's tough times, friends, I don't have to tell you, money's tight, there's a little scent of fear in the air, and jobs are in jeopardy... what the hell are we doing spending the money on...on...

And yet we persist. We work thousands of hours, creating worlds and creatures out of thin air, building and sewing and singing and shouting and whispering late into the night...we create a thing that is fleeting and brief, a thing of beauty that is born, lives, and dies in a moment. Why do we do this?

which means life. Kody and Cordero and Landecker and "hey, what do you have in your refrigerator?" For Kids gathered around pianos plotting songs, not soldiers around tables plotting death. We do it for Jackie Zupsic, face down and bubble-eyed; we do it for faithful Keya and Erica and Arriel, we do it for the sheer love of it; we do it for the actor who sees the light bulb above his and then reaches up and turns it on...

We do it for Lise Lange and Christina McCarthy and Chris Walas and Mike Madden, legitimate ARTISTS in their own right kindred spirits who know it's not the venue, it's the heart and passion—it's not the level, it's the ascent. We do it because there is no test, yet we are tested; no grade yet we submit ourselves to be judged.

We do it because we are privileged to watch you see your child as they truly are, in their hearts and the purity of their artistic souls and the caring and concern and love, hope, and exuberant joy they have for each other.

We do it because we have no business doing it. It is a defiant stance in a wishy washy world, and it defines who I am, who I want to be, what I find valuable in the world. We do it because love drives us, saves us, heals us, soothes the Beast within us and allows us to sleep peacefully by a dying fire, breathing ephemeral Beauty and my wife, my life...
